5 Skilled Trades Jobs In The U.S. With Stability And Consistency

Some trade jobs provide year-round employment prospects for people looking for security and regular work. Let's examine five options among them.



1. The Electrician

Whether it is the installation and maintenance of electrical and wiring system in a house, or maintaining complex electrical systems in industries, electricians are responsible for the safe and effective operation of electrical systems.

An electrician is always in demand due to the constant demand for power supply, technological advancements, and safety regulations. It is among the highest-paying trade jobs with various career paths available, including residential, commercial, and industrial electricians.

As reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, there will be a 6% growth in the employment of electricians from 2022 to 2032, which is faster than the average rate for all jobs. The number of electricians needed will be around 73,500 annually over the next decade.



2. Construction Technicians

Construction workers are responsible for planning, building, and maintaining infrastructure projects and renovating and maintaining existing structures.

It includes constructing and maintaining infrastructure and residential apartment buildings and engaging in trade construction by establishing workplaces, shops, and industries. The government requires the services of <u>construction workers</u> for projects that deal with public amenities like bridges, tunnels, and highways.

The US Bureau of Labor Statistics states that between 2022 and 2032, overall employment for workers and helpers in the construction sector is projected to rise by 4 percent. It is estimated that around 151,400 construction jobs will be available each year over the next decade.



3. HVAC Specialist

The necessity of HVAC systems (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) in making indoor areas comfortable is inevitable. HVAC technicians install, fix, and maintain these systems. As people become aware of energy efficiency and indoor air quality, more and more are interested in hiring and working with experts who have gone through HVAC training. This industry has several reliable career options, including refrigeration, commercial HVAC, or residential HVAC.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, <u>HVAC skilled trades</u> jobs are predicted to grow by 6% from 2022 to 2032. Over the next ten years, an average of about 37,700 positions per year for mechanics and installers of refrigeration, air conditioning, and heating systems are anticipated.



4. Welders

Welders are metal joining experts who use heat and pressure to do different types of welding projects. Their expertise is important in diverse manufacturing, construction, and maintenance sectors. Because of the increasing requirement for both infrastructure development as well as metal production, welders are in high demand. This trade offers a stable profession choice with options to specialize in fields like structural welding, pipeline welding, or even specialized welding techniques. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the employment of welders is anticipated to be the same between 2022 and 2032. Despite little growth in employment, an

average of 42,600 positions each year for welders are expected over the next ten years.



5. Carpenters

Carpenters are highly skilled artisans who construct buildings, furniture, and other structures using wood, among other materials. Their expertise is important in the construction industry. They perform tasks from installation to home building. Jobs in this sector will always be in demand, as housing, restoration works, and renovation are basic and continuous procedures. This field offers many other career paths, such as custom woodwork, commercial carpentry, and residential carpentry.

There is expected to be little to no change in the employment of carpenters from 2022 to 2032. Over the next ten years, an average of 79,500 carpenter positions are expected to become available each year despite little expansion in the employment sector.
